TEACH WHILE EARNING YOUR CREDENTIAL



The Preliminary Designated Subjects CTE Teaching Credential authorizes the holder to teach in the subject or subjects named on the credential in grades twelve and below and in classes organized primarily for adults, in career technical, trade or vocational courses.

DID YOU KNOW?

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE THREE-YEAR PRELIMINARY CREDENTIAL

- A high school diploma or equivalent (GED)
- At least three years of work experience in each career technical education subject you plan to teach; one year of work experience must be within the past five years or two years of work experience must be within the past 10 years

Career Technical Education (CTE) is one of the fastest growing areas of education. Sometimes known as Vocational Education, these courses prepare students for specific trades in 15 industry sectors.

Teachers pursuing a CTE credential come directly from those industry areas. They teach students the academic and technical content that provides them with the knowledge and skills to enter an occupation, or continue on to college.
