We are a Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM) school program offering 23 courses (19 of which are UC "a-g" approved) that prepare students for college and future careers.

The program is **FREE** for qualified 11th and 12th grade students who are training for a specific career path. Students who enroll in the program must commit to the **morning** (7:30 - 10:30 a.m.) or **afternoon** (12:45 - 3:45 p.m.) session Monday - Friday. Bus transportation is provided from the student's home high school to SVCTE and back to the home high school.

Our daytime Career Technical Education classes are designed specifically for high school students; adults may register on a space-available basis only.

These courses are academically challenging, involving substantial reading, writing, problems, and laboratory work. They show serious attention to analytical thinking and factual content and develop students' oral and listening skills. Of the 30 credits earned during the school year, 10 credits (1=1 year for UC) may be reported on a student's application for admission to any University of California or California State University.

Over 1,000 students take a broad range of courses each year, from Adult Basic Education, English as a Second Language (ESL), and High School Equivalency Preparation to Career Technical Education and online programs.

The Silicon Valley Regional Testing Center offers state and national tests such as GED, HiSET, CBEST, CSET, and CPACE, among many others, for the convenience of our students and community.

CalWORKS

CalWORKs is a program that helps eligible families become selfsupporting through temporary cash aid and assistance in finding and keeping a job. SVAE CalWORKS students complete at least:

- 75% of the term and continue in the next term.
- 40% of their Welfare-to-Work (WTW) program goal as scheduled during the academic year.

Additionally, 40% begin employment within six months after completing their initial 12-month WTW plan.





Student Gender




Student Ethnicity Profile ——








2021-22 Year End Expenses
