different areas of interest to students. Silicon Valley Adult Education Silicon Valley Adult Education (SVAE) offers adult education classes free of charge or at a low cost to adults 18 years or older

Some of our courses include English as a Some of our courses include English as a Second Language (ESL), Adult Basic Education (ABE), High School Equivalency (HSE) preparation for GED and HISET tests, and High School Diploma (HSD) subject

SVAE is a comprehensive adult school offering entry-level and advanced courses in medical assisting, dental assisting, Google Sulte, machining, diesel, welding, and other careers in the trades. Students range anywhere from 18 to 83 years old.

This last year, 88 percent of students passed citizen Interview tests, and over 4,600 certifications were taken in our Regional Testing Center. Whether It is through SVCTE or SVAE,

without a doubt Metropolitan Education District provides hands-on, life-changing experiences which ignite the passion of our community of learners. This allows our students to be prepared for

high wage-high-skill careers so they can live and stay in Silicon Valley.
